

## **Williamstown Borough Meeting Minutes**

### **April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022**

Williamstown Borough Council met Monday, April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 7:30 PM in Council Chambers. Present were: President Dane Williard, Vice President Ronald Umholtz, Brian Troup, Steve Denkovich, Mayor Jeffrey Shuttleswoth, Solicitor Joseph Kerwin, and Secretary Rikki Merwine. Absent was Donald Machamer and Road Supervisor Bill Miller.

Citizens Present: Woody Fregia, Rosemary Hoke

The pledge of allegiance was recited. Minutes from the March 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

Woody Fregia was present to express concern of his yard caving in due to a rush going through and being exposed. The Borough explained that they are not responsible and did not place the pipes under in the yard. The Borough suggested to Woody to place plastic piping through the yard.

The Mayors Report was given with \$109.32 received from the District Justice. \$586.60 was received from Dauphin County Victim Witness Restitution. The Tax Collectors report for the month of March was reviewed with \$75,512.53 received in Real Estate Taxes, \$7488.68 received in Street Light Taxes, \$18,311.30 received in Occupation Taxes and \$896.70 received in Per Capita Taxes.

Solicitor Joseph Kerwin reported that the check is on the way from county to pay Maurer Excavating for the demolition of the 2 properties at west and market. The legion started their part of the contract to turn the property into a parking lot. ARPA reporting is due by April 30<sup>th</sup>. The money will be used toward generators/Hvac/building repairs.

The road supervisor report was reviewed.

It was reported that 306 E Market has plead guilty to their fines. They will pay 40/month. The registration of vehicles on property was questioned. A roofing permit on Walnut street was approved. 237 E Market had the trash removed that was piling up, and the landlord has yet to catch up on water payments. An appraiser from 203 west market contacted, and Ron gave the information that was needed.

A proposal from Lentz Electric for generator installation was reviewed.

Road Supervisor Bill Miller is still working on the 2010 truck to put up for bids. Ron Umholtz motioned to get bids. Stephen Denkovich 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor.

Ron Umholtz motioned to pay the bills for \$48,323.59 and payroll for \$7,171.36. Stephen Denkovich 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor.

Stephen Denkovich motioned to adjourn at 8:00 PM. Ron Umholtz 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor.
